Room 4 / Teen Time Renovations

Renovation work started in Room 4 this week. The room will receive a dramatic make-over, including,

new kitchen, new bathroom, new lighting and paintwork. Our thanks go to Teen Time and Lower Hunter Temporary Care who have provided the funding to renovate the room.

Schools are required to regularly review a range of school policy to ensure they are current and comply to Department of Education requirements.

After a review of our Prescribed Medications policy, it has been identified that we need to improve our procedures for exchanging medication from home to school. The following recommendations have been made:

- · Where possible at least one weeks supply of medication must arrive at school each Monday morning.
- Medication must:
 - a) be bought to school in the original prescription package/box with the label clearly stating the student's name and medication dosage. OR
 - b) be bought to school in a Webster pack.
- Any request for a change to medication <u>must</u> be accompanied by a letter from the prescribing doctor.
