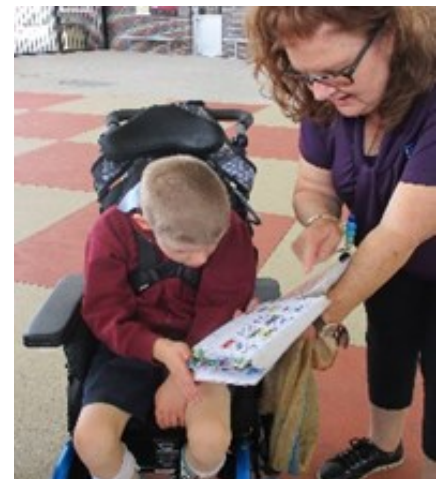

I look forward to seeing just how much we all learn by the end of the year.

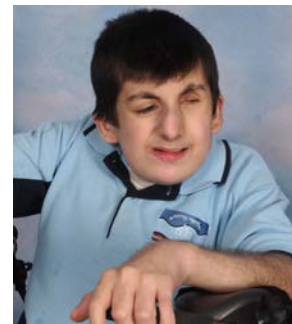


Student Leader Awards

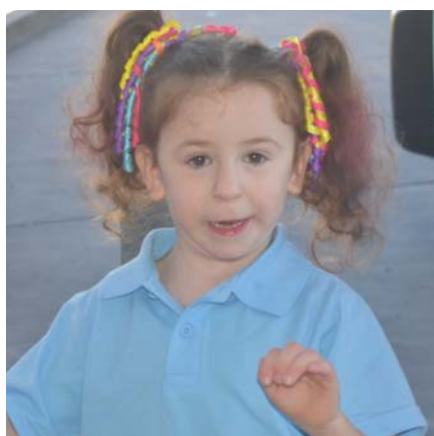

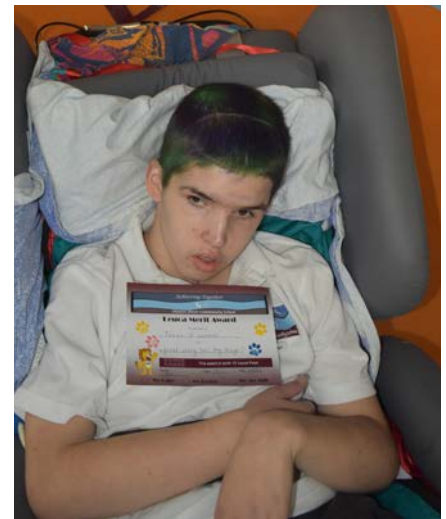
