Walk a Mile Koori Style Sponsorship Prospectus 2019

Walk a Mile Koori Style© (WAMKS) has been an annual event for the Newcastle community since 2013. It was inspired by the international campaign, Walk a Mile in Her Shoes®, which asks men to walk one mile wearing women's high-heeled shoes in order to raise awareness about the impact of violence against women.

WAMKS is an event led by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander males, and men and boys from all nations and cultures are encouraged to participate. This walk is for all men to say NO to domestic violence and advocate for an end to violence in their communities.

Instead of wearing high-heeled shoes, men and boys are encouraged to walk a mile "Koori Style", wearing the same coloured t-shirt with a unique Indigenous design. Every year the boys and men taking part in the walk are provided with a free t-shirt. The colour for this year's t-shirt is **yellow**.

WAMKS will be held on **Friday 6 December 2019** and will be held in two locations – **Newcastle** and **Cessnock**.
